

#### Introduction

This Lent offers a time to reflect on the Jubilee Year theme Pilgrims of Hope. The biblical Jubilee was based on the hope that God's presence in our world would restore justice to the broken social world. In the biblical agrarian society, a household's small plot of land was their primary source of survival and wealth. The Israelites believed the land was God's (Leviticus 25:23) and had been given to them and distributed to the tribes and their households forever. The Jubilee every 50 years (see Leviticus 25) was a restorative practice recognizing the inalienable right to family land and thus sought to undo the many ways a family's land could be lost—debt, taxes, mismanagement, disaster, famine, loan foreclosures, debt slavery and swindling by rich and greedy absentee landlords. Jubilee thus became a powerful reminder of God's desire for justice and so a constant source of hope for a more just society in which all households could not only survive but thrive together in shalom—peace and wellbeing for all.

In this booklet, we invite you to walk on your Lenten journey as pilgrims of renewed hope by using a brief daily prayer from Pope Francis or one of the saints coupled with a biblical verse anytime you wish to deepen your hope for yourself and a world transformed by God's ruling presence.
