

# **Mysteries!**

At Mass, after the bread and wine are changed into the body and blood of Jesus, we are invited to proclaim "the mystery of our faith," which is about Jesus' death and resurrection to new life which puts us into the right relationship with God. Lent is a time when we can learn more about these most important events.

You might think the word *mystery* means a puzzle—maybe a puzzle that only a detective can solve! Every mystery tells us that something is hidden, that there's a secret, and a puzzle to solve.

The Church uses the word *mystery* in a different religious way. The Church uses the word mystery to tell us about how God creates a new relationship with us that comes through Jesus' death and resurrection. It's not a puzzle, but we still work hard to listen and learn. When the Church points us to the *mystery of our faith*, we know we must work to understand.

This Lent, let's go on a journey to learn about the mystery of our faith! We'll travel through the days of Lent to the great mystery of Easter. On our Lenten journey, we'll travel with God's words and the Church's prayers. We'll travel to the desert with Jesus. We'll travel to a well in Samaria and then all the way to Jerusalem with Jesus—and beyond.

Do you have a backpack that you can use through the days of Lent? Every Sunday you will add one item to your backpack. *Or you can make your own backpack from a paper bag!* 



## Paper Bag Backpack-You'll need:

A brown paper lunch sack or small grocery bag Colorful construction paper • Scissors • Glue

- 1. From construction paper cut a flap for your backpack.
- 2. Glue one side of the flap to one side of the paper sack to cover the top. Make sure the flap is long enough to fold over the top of your backpack.
- 3. From construction paper cut two long straps for your backpack. Glue them to the back of your backpack.

Now you're ready for the journey. Each day in Lent, turn to the next activity in the book.

But at the beginning of our journey through Lent we see a different kind of love. God loves us so much that he sent Jesus


to us. Jesus loves us so much that every day he waits for us to come to him in our thoughts, in our prayers, and in everything we do.



## **First Tuesday in Lent**

Okay, now that we know how to find any verse we want, let's go back to our two stories: Jesus goes to the desert and Noah leaves in the ark with all his family.

How can these stories be alike? The desert is hot and dry. The ark sails on the cool waters. Jesus is all alone. Noah takes his family along for the journey.

The Church teaches us that these stories are alike in at least three ways:

1.In both stories we hear a promise from God.

- In both stories we see God's People at peace with wild animals.
- In both stories God takes care of God's People in the hardest times.

Let's start with the promises from God! In the story of Noah, we hear a promise from God to protect life on earth. God calls this promise a covenant and sets a rainbow in the sky so we can see it and remember God's love.







# **Fourth Sunday of Lent**

the dirt into clay. He put this clay on the eyes of the blind man. He told him to go wash in the pool now. The blind man obeyed—and he could see!



The Easter candle will burn every day at Mass throughout the time of Easter. You and your family can make an Easter candle, too.




